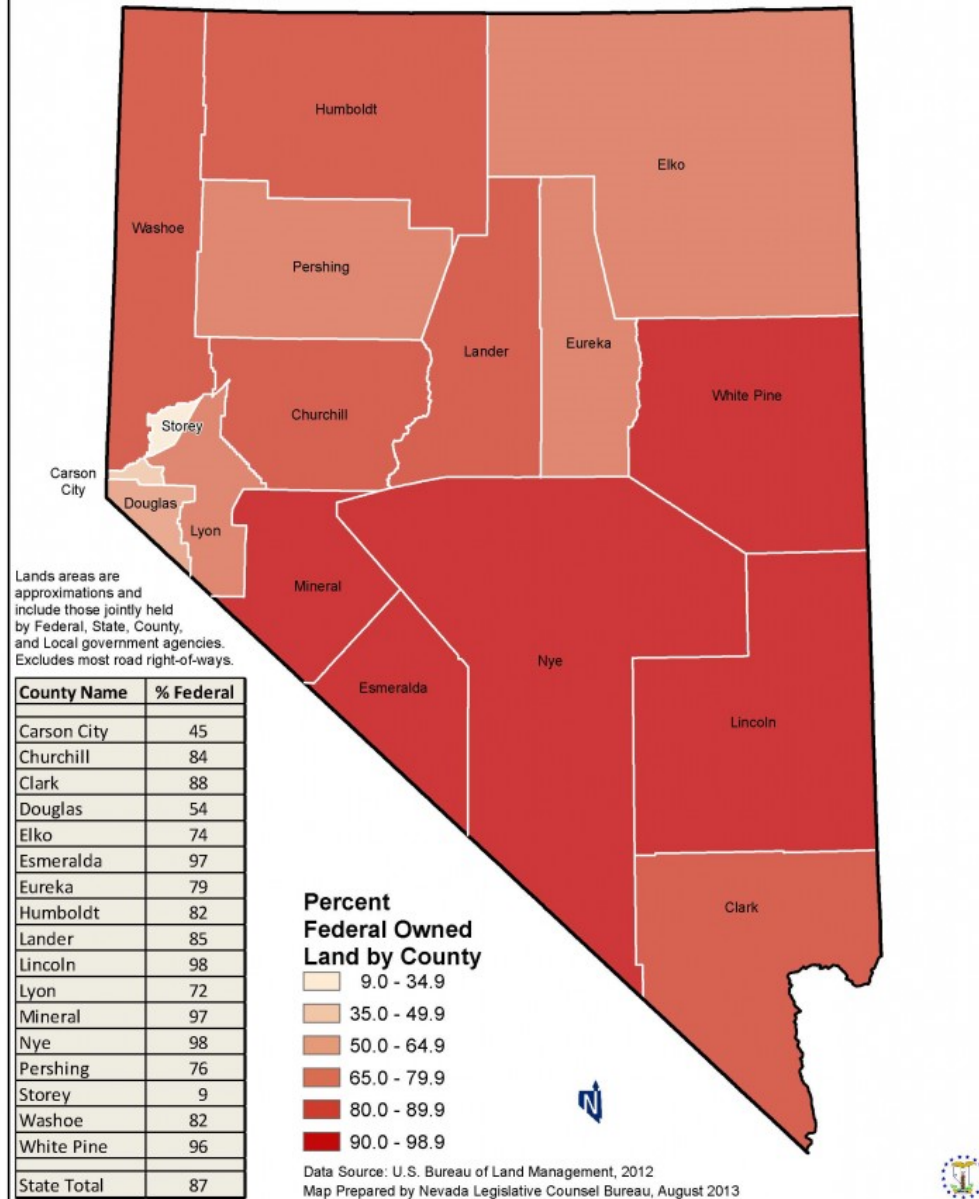

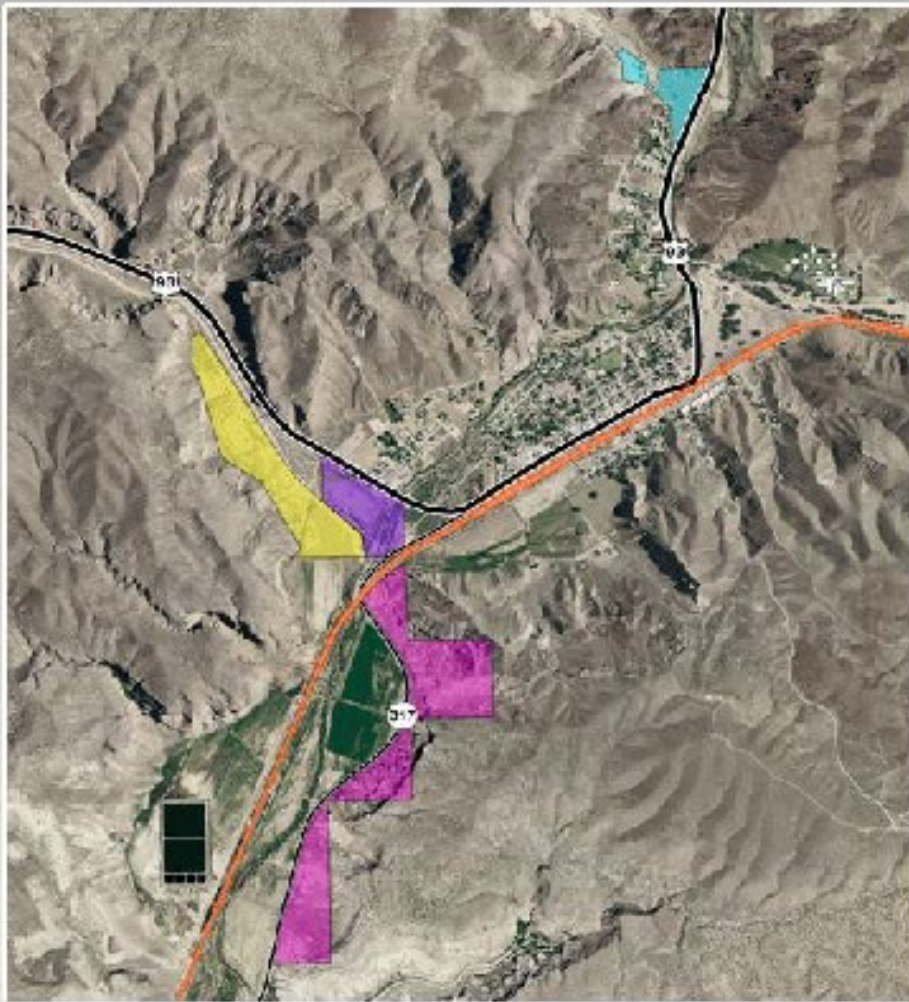


 Los Angeles to Denver Corridor



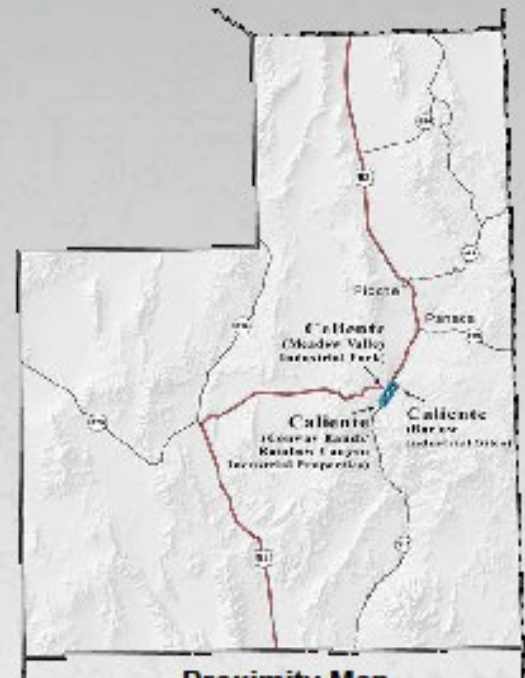

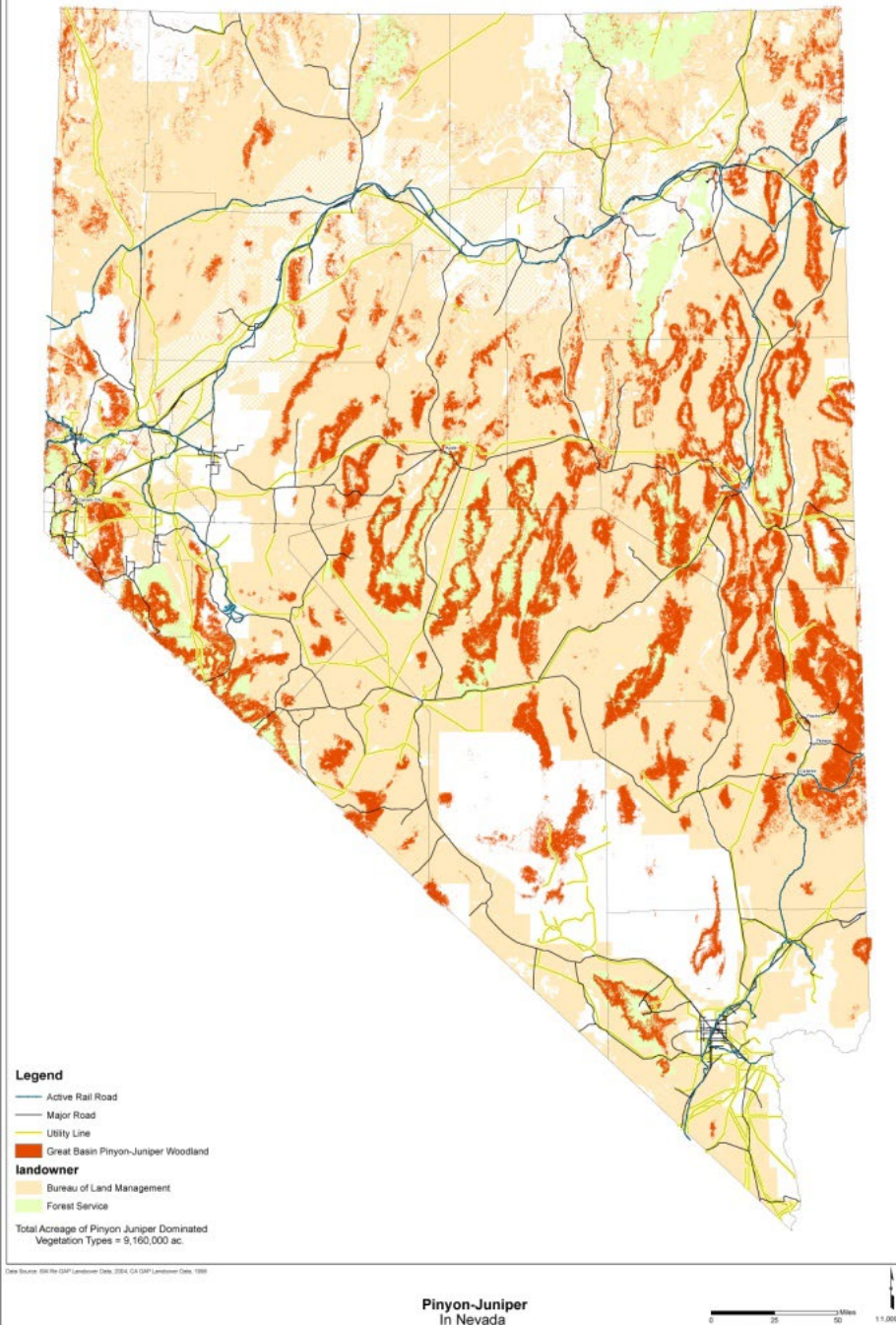
Proximity Map

WHAT TO KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

To ensure a safe and enjoyable visit to Lincoln County Nevada, please travel with care and read the safety tips and frequently asked questions below. Remember, this is a high mountain desert environment with open range highways, so please be prepared!

WHAT IS OPEN RANGE?
 Open range means no fences or "open range" which means that the property is not fenced and it's the responsibility of the driver to avoid any existing animal husbandry, deer, elk, sheep and wild horses. Open range is to be used as the driver's responsibility and not the responsibility of the state. It is the driver's responsibility to avoid any existing animal husbandry, deer, elk, sheep and wild horses.

WHAT SHOULD I BRING WHILE TRAVELING LINCOLN COUNTY?
 Always have a full tank of gas, water, food, and a first aid kit. Always have a map, a compass, and a cell phone. Always have a spare tire and a spare battery for your car.

ARE THERE OFF ROAD DRIVING OPPORTUNITIES?
 Yes, there are many off road driving opportunities in Lincoln County. However, it is important to be prepared for the possibility of being stuck in a remote area. Always have a spare tire and a spare battery for your car.

IS THERE CELL PHONE RECEPTION?
 Cell phone reception is spotty in Lincoln County. It is important to have a spare battery for your car and a map.

 Please follow the principles of Leave No Trace:
 1. Plan Ahead and Prepare
 2. Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces
 3. Dispose of Waste Properly
 4. Leave What You Find
 5. Respect Wildlife
