WHAT DO WE DO?

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board (NBPAB) provides Nevada residents with a voice in leaders' decisions in shaping the quality of life for bicyclists and pedestrians. NBPAB is responsible for advising the Governor, the Legislature and state agencies.

The NBPAB was created by the State Legislature to promote programs and improved infrastructure to ensure the safety of bicyclists and pedestrians.

Our objectives include:

- ⦿ Providing decision-makers with input to create bicycle and pedestrian facilities for entities/developers upgrading or designing new projects and communities
- ⦿ Advise relevant state agencies on policy decisions and proposed legislation to support bike/ped safety legislation

WHO ARE WE?

The NBPAB consists of 14 Members appointed by the Governor. Seven members represent Nevada's bicycle and pedestrian stakeholders; seven members represent state agencies whose overview relates to bicycling and walking.

The NBPAB serves to relay citizens' concerns and innovations to state and local agencies to incorporate into the planning and development process.
