The Nevada Department of Transportation keeps the official record of all proceedings of the meeting. In order to maintain a complete and accurate record, copies of documents used during presentation must be submitted to the Recording Secretary.

The Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board appreciates the time citizens devote to be involved in this important process.

Public comment is limited to 5 minutes per person.

**5. Introduction of Newly Appointed Members to the Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board** *Jeff White*

**6. Humboldt County Bicycle Plan** *Bill Story* (for possible action)

A bicycle plan has been completed for Humboldt County by NDOT staff and its consultant. This plan was approved by the Humboldt County Commission on February 1, 2016. The plan, if approved by the NDOT, will become part of the Statewide Bicycle Plan. Action may be taken to make an advisory recommendation to the NDOT to approve or reject this plan.

**7. State Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (SCORP)** *Jennifer Scanland*

The SCORP is developed by the Division of State Parks to identify trends and propose goals for Nevada's outdoor recreation. An overview of the SCORP process will be presented.

**8. State Active Transportation Plan** *Jessica Lamb*

The Department of Health and Human Services will be developing an Active Transportation Plan for Nevada. An overview of this effort will be presented.

**9. Receive a report on the 2016 Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Summit** *Tim Rowe* (for possible action)

The 2016 Summit will be held in Lake Tahoe in cooperation with the Tahoe Bicycle Coalition. It is tentatively planned for early summer. An overview of summit coordination and future Summit scheduling will be discussed. Action may be taken to change the frequency and/or calendar season for future summits.

**10. Revision of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board Bylaws** *Jeff White, Chair* (for possible action)

The Board will discuss updating of its Bylaws based on its current Mission and Objectives. Action may be taken to approve revisions to the NBPAB Bylaws.

**11. Report of Nevada Moves Day 2016** *Tim Rowe*

Nevada Moves Day was established by the NDOT and the State's various Safe Routes to School partner agencies to encourage school age children (grades K-8), and their parents, to walk and bike to school. Nevada Moves Day 2016 took place on March 16<sup>th</sup>. A report of this year's activities will be given.

**12. Report from the 2016 National Bicycle Summit held in Washington D.C.**

The NDOT funded NBPAB members to attend the 2016 National Bicycle Summit held on March 7-9, 2016, in Washington D.C. A report of what new items and issues of national interest were presented at the summit, will be given.

**13. Report on Proposed Legislation** *Bill Story*

The Nevada Legislature will be holding its 79<sup>th</sup> session in 2017. An overview of known proposed legislative changes related to bicycles or pedestrians will be given.

**14. Report on Share the Road Specialty License Plates** *Albert Jacquez (for possible action)*

The NBPAB developed a “Share the Road” specialty license plate to provide additional funding for local bicycle and pedestrian initiatives throughout the state. An overview of current sales status and funding balance will be given. Action may be taken to form a workgroup to develop and implement sales strategies to increase license plate sales.

**15. Reports From the Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs Statewide**

An update of projects and initiatives being worked on by the NDOT and the two large Metropolitan Planning Areas will be given.

**16. Board Member Reports**
