- 1. Action to call meeting to order**
- 2. Roll call of NBPAB members**
- 3. PUBLIC COMMENT AND CITIZENS PARTICIPATION:** No action may be taken on any matter discussed under this item that is not listed on this Agenda, although the NBPAB can direct that such items be placed on a future agenda.

At this time any citizen in the audience may address the NBPAB on any matter. No vote can be taken on a matter not listed on the posted agenda; however, the NBPAB can direct that the matter be placed on a future agenda.

Each citizen must be recognized by the Chairman. The citizen is then to approach the microphone to state his or her name, and to spell the last name for the record. The Chairman may limit remarks, if such remarks are disruptive to the meeting, except within the NBPAB's jurisdiction.

Public comment is limited to 5 minutes per person.

Agenda items may be taken out of the order presented on the agenda at the discretion of the chairperson. The Board may combine two or more agenda items for consideration. The Board may remove an item from the agenda or delay discussion relating to an agenda item at any time. The Board may make reasonable restrictions on time, place, and manner but will not restrict the comments based upon viewpoint.

4. Approval of the March 17th, 2016 minutes (for possible action)

Action may be taken to approve the March 17th, 2016 minutes meeting minutes.

General Meeting Items.

Presentations are limited to 10 minutes per presenter.

- 5. Presentation of the NDOT Complete Streets Policy Initiative** *Lori Campbell, NDOT Safety Engineering* **(for possible action)**
The NDOT has contracted with Kimley-Horn Associates to develop a Complete Streets Policy for the agency. An overview of the purpose and implementation of this policy, once completed, will be given. Action may be taken to provide recommendations related to the draft Complete Streets policy process.
- 6. Pedestrian Safety Improvement Analysis** *Lori Campbell, NDOT Safety Engineering* **(for possible action)**
The Safety Engineering Division of the NDOT has developed a “draft guidance” to be used for analysis of need related to pedestrian safety improvements. An overview of this process will be presented. Action may be taken to provide recommendations related to the draft Pedestrian Safety Improvement Analysis process.
- 7. Elko County Bicycle Plan** *Bill Story* **(for possible action)**
A bicycle plan has been completed for Elko County by NDOT staff and its consultant. This plan was approved by the Elko County Commission on May 5, 2016. The plan, if approved by the NDOT, will become part of the Statewide Bicycle Plan. Action may be taken to approve the Board’s making of an advisory recommendation to the NDOT to approve or reject this plan.
- 8. RTC of Southern Nevada Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan presentation** *Ron Floth*
The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC-SN) has initiated efforts to update and revise the Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan. This regional plan was last completed in 2008. A consultant has been contracted to work with RTC staff to update the plan for the period between October 2015 to March 2017. An overview of this process will be given.
- 9. “Stop” vs. “Yield” Pedestrian Laws** *Bill Story* **(for possible action)**
Nevada law currently provides a requirement that vehicles must “yield” to pedestrians in legal crosswalks. It has been suggested that changing this “yield” requirement to a “stop” requirement may reduce pedestrian fatalities and injuries. A review and discussion of the latest data related to “stop” vs. “yield” will be presented. Action may be taken to approve the Board’s making of an advisory recommendation to appropriate State agencies regarding a proposed statutory change in the pedestrian law.

- 10. Discussion of the NBPAB Interaction with the Nevada Transportation Board**
Ken Mammen (for possible action)
The Board will discuss, and may approve a plan, on how to increase its interaction with the Nevada Transportation Board.
- 11. Revision of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Board Bylaws** *Jeff White, Chair (for possible action)*
The Board will discuss requested changes to its Bylaws based on its current Mission and Objectives and financial status. Action may be taken to approve revisions to the NBPAB Bylaws.
- 12. Elko Cycling Community Concerns update– SR227 and SR535** *Bill Story*
Recent construction on SR277 and SR535 in Elko involved the resurfacing of SR277 and the installation of continuous shoulder rumble strips along with the adding of guard rails in some sections. Some members of the local Elko cycling community have expressed concerns and perceive that some of these roadway improvements may not meet standards and/or guidelines for the accommodation of bicyclists. An overview of the current status of mitigations being explored by the NDOT District III regarding these concerns will be given.
- 13. Review of Statewide Bicycle Touring Map Update** *Janie Fromm (for possible action)*
The NDOT develops and publishes a Nevada Bicycle Map. These maps are available free of charge to the public. The current proposed revision will be discussed and may be approved.
- 14. Report on Share the Road Specialty License Plates** *Albert Jacquez (for possible action)*
The NBPAB developed a “Share the Road” specialty license plate to provide additional funding for local bicycle and pedestrian initiatives throughout the state. An overview of current sales status and funding balance will be given. Action may be taken to form a workgroup to develop and implement sales strategies to increase license plate sales.
- 15. Report on Complete Streets Funding Program** *Bill Story*
The Nevada Legislature provided for a voluntary Complete Streets funding program for local County level transportation entities. An overview of current county government participation and funding collected will be given.
- 16. Reports From the Bicycle and Pedestrian Programs Statewide**
An update of projects and initiatives being worked on by the NDOT Bicycle & Pedestrian Program will be given.

17. Board Member Reports

Reports from NBPAB members will be given on those activities, initiatives or issues specific to their sectors occurring since the last meeting on March 17th, 2016. Particular items of interest may be agendized for a future meeting.

18. Schedule and prepare items to be placed on the next agenda (For possible action)

The next NBPAB meeting is proposed to be scheduled for July 21st, 2016.
